EXCEPTIONAL ITEMS

Purchase four high-profile water evacuation vehicles

Existing vehicles are unreliable and frequently break down, impacting mission effectiveness

New high-profile vehicles are purpose-built and will increase life-saving mission capability

Allows responders to evacuate large groups of people out of a flood or hurricane disaster

Create and support a regional task force in the Rio Grande Valley region

Response time for trained personnel to respond from College Station would be reduced by a locally available resource

More lives can be saved during disasters by supporting personnel and equipment in the region

Purchase twelve inflatable rescue boats with trailers and motors

Provide more available rescue boats across the state to increase water rescue capabilities

Additional local jurisdictions would have access to boats during disaster emergencies to conduct rapid response to save lives
